EVENTS: Who We Work With

- 1. Event Organizers: help navigate City-wide event application and permitting processes

- 3. Residents, RNOS, Businesses and BIDs: oversee event notification requirements and facilitates good neighbor discussions and agreements



Public Events on Public Property

Supports <u>all</u> event organizers who want to hold events that are:

- Open to the public
- Held on public property
- Temporary in nature
- Require support/permits from more than one City agency

Community Notification Process

Community Notifications are REQUIRED for OSEP

Event notification flyer must be reviewed and approved by OSE

Notifications emailed 45 days AND 1 week before event to:

- RNOs and BIDs
- City Council Office(s)
- DPD District Contacts

Notification hand delivered to residents and businesses next to and extending 1 city block from route/venue for events with road closures and/or >5,000 attendees

Recent Changes

August 2021

OSE was added to the City and County of Denver ordinance

January 1, 2022

Public events held on public property are REQUIRED to obtain an Office of Special Event Permit (OSEP)

November 1, 2022

OSEP Application, Rush and Late Fees charged for 2023 events



NEW OSEP Application Fees

OSEP Application Processing Fee

\$25 - \$250 based on total daily attendance

Rush Fee

- If OSEP application is submitted 59 days or less before first event date
- Equal to the application processing fee
- Encourages timely submissions which supports thorough reviews that promote event safety

Late Fee

- If any City requirements are not completed by 5 business days before first event date
- Equal to the application processing fee
- Encourages timely submission of all supporting documentation



Fees & Fee Structure

Total Number of Daily Attendees	Fee
1-350	\$25
351-3,000	\$75
3,001-10,000	\$150
10,001+	\$250

Only one OSEP Application Processing Fee is charged per year for multiday and recurring events (e.g., farmer's markets, multi-day festivals).



OSEP Fee Waivers

OSEP Application Processing Fees will be <u>waived in full</u> for small, community events that meet ALL of the following three criteria:

- 1. The host organization of the event provides ongoing direct charitable, development or community support services to the neighborhood in which the event is being held, separate from the event itself.
- 2. The **host organization is a non-profit**, registered and in good standing with the Colorado Secretary of State's Office **OR is a Registered Neighborhood Organization** with the City and County of Denver (CCD) (does *not* include Business Improvement Districts (BIDs)).
- 3. The event has an estimated daily total attendance of 3,000 or fewer.



OSEP Fee Waiver Notes

- Requests for OSEP fee waivers will be submitted through the OSEP online application
- Fee waivers apply to OSEP Application Processing Fees only
 not other CCD agency fees
- RUSH and LATE fees still apply
- Event organizers with waived fees are still accountable for meeting all applicable CCD requirements
