A Little Background About Us

- Winston Downs Community Association/WDCA is a Registered Neighborhood Organization/RNO within the City of Denver and was established in late 1970's
- We are a member of Denver INC
- Resident membership is by household and is voluntary
- Board and other leaders are volunteers from the neighborhood. Board meets via Zoom the third Tuesday monthly
- Board deals with a variety of issues such as zoning, clean up, safety, information flow, unity-building social events, etc.

All residents are welcome to attend our meetings & to reach out to us with concerns, questions, suggestions.

What We Do

- Keep city and area information flowing to residents and how to access various city services and local area events
- Answer concerns, questions, suggestions expressed to us by residents
- Monitor, review and inform residents about neighborhood related changes and impacts
- Set up public meetings for neighborhood-wide concerns such as safety, hot topics, zoning changes, etc.
- Set up social events to encourage neighbors to know one another which helps to unify our community of residents

How We Communicate

- Two printed newsletters a year and we distribute door hanger announcements for public meetings, events
- Neighborhood signage for public meetings
- All residents may opt into our eNews dues not required. 60% of the occupied households are signed up currently.
- Current updates and calendared items also entered on website
- Board meets via Zoom for ease of attending
 - eNews invitations to attend board meetings are sent to all registered
 - All residents are welcome to attend all of our meetings

Neighborhood Updates

- > 333 S Oneida Way: Change of use to religious assembly was abandoned; house was sold and is now occupied by a family
- Winston Downs, in full, will now fall under Council District 5
- Newport/Alameda traffic light installed in fall of 2022 to support safe ped and bike crossing north/south across Alameda
- Welcome bags delivered to over a dozen new neighbors
- > Timing reset on light at E. Expo/Monaco for safer student crossing
- WDCA initiated: Verizon claim to fix sidewalk at Monaco/Center in process through City of Denver
- Cash for Trash program was passed by City Council and initiated in January.
- Voters approved sidewalk fees to begin in 2023

Treasurer Report/Membership

Joanna Milewski, Treasurer

- > Treasury as of end of March 2023
 - Income from dues \$2,380
 - Income from added donations \$996
 - Total in bank \$11,045 (3/31/2023)
 - Budget is about \$5100 per year
- Membership to date = 119 households = about 22% of occupied homes (540 +/-) within our neighborhood – includes rentals
- Dues remain at only \$20 per household/per calendar year
 Can join anytime Payment Options: online, by check or cash

What Dues Pay For

- Newsletters, printed announcements to each household
- Website, eNews, Zoom access to board & other meetings
- Neighborhood perimeter weed abatement
- Meeting Venues (such as BMH)
- Operations and cushion for unexpected expenses
- Signage for Meetings & Events
- > Neighborhood socials, every other year garage sale

WDCA Board Elections

- WDCA uses a staggered board election to ensure year over year continuity; participation is voluntary
 - Seven seats total
 - Term is two years
 - This year we elect four (4) seats
- All are elected as "directors" and that group determines who will serve in which positions/roles based on willingness, time, ability
- Having a board ensures Winston Downs will continue to have a voice as a Registered Neighborhood Organization, and that we may be a member with Denver's Inter-Neighborhood Cooperationthe umbrella group of RNO's
