

District 3 Denver Police Citizens Advisory Board (CAB) Meeting Recap

The featured speakers, Detective Kate Young, cancelled at the last minute so there was no presentation on the detective role in District 3 this month. It made for a short meeting.

Personnel Changes

- Lt Jason Vincent is replacing Lt Julie Wheaton as our Sector 2 lead, (she is moving over to Sector 1 to replace David Timmerman who is leaving District 3 for the “geek squad”, the electronics and drome group). Lt Vincent was recently promoted to lieutenant having previously worked in Districts 2 and 5 as well as Internal Affairs.
- The new CRO head is Sgt James McClelland who replaced Kiarra Jenkins who moved downtown to HR. Sgt McClelland grew up in Denver, attended Thomas Jefferson HS. He started in DPD in 2013 in District 1 and transferred to District 3 as a sergeant in 2023.
- Aaron Escalante is the new CRO in our Sector 2 joining Manny Fuentes. He has served as a patrol officer and has VICE/detective training

Jewish Holidays and September 11th

- There was discussion of heightened security for the upcoming Jewish holidays and the anniversary of September 11th. The district is on high alert and there are extra patrols planned.

Miscellaneous

- I used the meeting to talk to Manny and Aaron about the homeless encampment at the stairs on S Oneida St and they got the Homeless Team out there the next day, but the encampment was already gone. I heard from a friend who lives on the street that apparently the neighborhood dogs encouraged the homeless to move on. On Sep 6th we reported a homeless man with a shopping cart on Exposition near me close to Monaco and had Patrol come out and they verified he moved out west of Monaco.
- District 3 has a Shield 3 Program to target high crime areas with the focus now on the South Broadway area.
- There is a city-wide Violent Crimes Mitigation Task Force that is having a positive impact
- Crime in our precinct 322 continues to show downward numbers in the three look-back analysis. Persons crime is down 10.8%, Property crime down 28.1%, Society (was previously called Public) crime down 2.6% for a sum of a 20.6 decline. Low numbers for Society crime is good because it implies more active policing for things like drugs, traffic, etc.
